Suffrage Movement Exhibit at Tuck Museum

The year 2020 marks the 100th anniversary of the passing of the 19th Amendment: "The rights of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex."

Courageous, forward thinking, strong men and women stood up for what they believed to get the vote for women in the United States in 1920. It was a long journey from Abigail Adams asking John Adams to "remember the ladies" as he helped draft the Constitution for the 13 colonies, to abolitionists, temperance supporters, and the suffragists, as they all fought for those who were denied their common rights for many years.

The exhibit at the Tuck Museum pays tribute to the long journey to suffrage and justice in our democracy, with the passage of the 19th Amendment

The first woman to vote in Hampton, NH in 1920 was Lucy A. Marston. She was the mother of teacher Adeline C. Marston.

"Inside Joseph's Trunk" Exhibit

Father and daughter team Joseph and Lucy Dow wrote the *History of the Town of Hampton*. Historian Joseph would die in 1889, before the manuscript was complete. Lucy would edit and publish the history in 1895. Exhausted from the effort, she would pass at the age of 56 in 1896.

What is in Joseph's Trunk will tell some of the story of this dynamic duo who wrote the History of Hampton.
